TOPIC : CONJUNCTIONS

A Conjunction is a word used for joining words or sentences.

Examples:

- 1. Ram came to my house. His sister came to my house. Ram <u>and</u> his sister came to my house.
- Misha worked hard. She failed in the exam. Misha worked hard <u>but</u> she failed in the exam.
- 3. You should work hard. You will fail in the exam. You should work <u>or</u> you will fail in the exam.
- 4. I missed the bus. I got up late. I missed the bus <u>because</u> I got up late.
- 5. You do your best. You will surely succeed. If you do your best, you will surely succeed.

So in the above sentences 'and', 'but', 'or', 'because' and 'If' are called Conjunctions as they join two sentences

(You can also say that these words help in conjugation (combining two sentences into one) of sentences.)
